

Stockton Housing Innovation Fund 2024

Program Overview and Information

THE SAN JOAQUIN COMMUNITY FOUNDATION is pleased to invite eligible organizations to submit proposals for grant funding from the **Stockton Housing Innovation Fund** (SHIF). SHIF was created as a community-designed and driven source of financing. It is intended to be responsive to local housing needs and invest directly into the Stockton community with the overall goal of reducing housing insecurity. The Stockton Housing Innovation Fund moves toward this goal by supporting local, impactful, and innovative solutions with funding to improve housing access and outcomes.

SHIF has three areas of focus, which were developed by a Design Team composed of nine (9) individuals with diverse lived experience and expertise on housing in Stockton. In 2022, they developed a <u>Design Report</u>, which outlined the goals and focus for this funding. In phase 3 of the design process, the Design Team and facilitators (JSI and Reinvent South Stockton Coalition) solicited applications for the Community Oversight Board which required one-third of members be representative of the community with lived experiences as long-time renters, being unhoused, residents in affordable or public housing, those who have purchased their first home in Stockton and/or those who participate in grassroots advocacy initiatives.




Figure 1 - Design Team Process, JSI

Grants from SHIF are available to fund projects and activities that serve low to moderate-income people living in the City of Stockton, and directly align with one or more of the SHIF's areas of focus: *improving local capacity around affordable housing, innovative solutions to address housing insecurity, and addressing racial disparities in current housing systems.* For 2024, SHIF is accepting requests for eligible projects from all three areas of focus.

FUNDING FOR 2024

The Chan Zuckerberg Initiative (CZI), James Irvine Foundation, and The California Endowment have generously provided a total of \$350,000 to be regranted by the San Joaquin Community Foundation for this grant program in 2024. Additional funds may be made available during this round of funding. The maximum amount an applicant may request under this program is \$75,000 although applicants may request less than the maximum amount.

TIMEFRAME FOR USING GRANT MONIES

The timeframe to expend grant monies is one calendar year from the date of signed contract.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Those organizations receiving grant awards will be required to submit minimal mid-year progress and final reports, as well as a financial report.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

All organizations applying for SHIF funding must serve low and moderate-income households within the City of Stockton. The San Joaquin Community Foundation will accept applications from the following organizations:

- Non Profit organizations that are tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- Institutions of higher education
- Public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities
- Special district governments
- Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized)
- Native American tribal organizations (other than Federally recognized tribal governments)

SHIF GOVERNANCE AND SELECTION PROCESS

This fund is governed by a Community Oversight Board (COB) of nine local residents with lived and professional experience around housing insecurity and affordable housing initiatives in Stockton. Proposals will be reviewed and scored by the SHIF Community Oversight Board with a goal of funding a minimum of one application within each focus area, listed below. Awards will be made by the San Joaquin Community Foundation's Board of Directors, based on recommendations provided by the Community Oversight Board. Decisions made by the Board of Directors are final.

AREAS OF FOCUS

The San Joaquin Community Foundation will accept applications from eligible organizations that propose projects or activities that serve low to moderate-income residents of Stockton and directly align with one or more of the SHIF areas of focus (developed by the SHIF Design Team) below. Projects may address more than one of the focus areas, but organizations will be asked to select one as the main focus in the application. Funding requests can be for new or ongoing projects or activities.

- DEVELOP LOCAL CAPACITY AROUND AFFORDABLE HOUSING
- INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS TO ADDRESS HOUSING INSECURITY
- ADDRESSING RACIAL DISPARITIES

Preference in the application review process will be given to funding projects within the above areas of focus. Example activities that can be funded include applications that address one or more of the following (this list is not exhaustive):

- Support unhoused or housing insecure families to find/keep housing
- Create opportunities for transitional housing for unhoused individuals
- Assist populations with high rates of homelessness, such as LGBTQIA+ and foster youth, to find and keep housing
- Reduce barriers for housing development and promote policies to support unhoused and housing insecure Stocktonians
- Advance a community-centered housing agenda and build resident support for solutions
- Increase access for more local organizations and companies to the competitive funding landscape
- First-time homeownership
- Increasing supply of affordable housing
- Prevent and/or addressing ongoing displacement
- Address needs of the unsheltered population
- Emergency preparedness and response (as it relates to housing stability and security)
- Explicitly address decades of discriminatory housing policy by empowering the most affected residents to shape current policy
- Support local CBOs that advance the interests of communities of color
- Remove systemic barriers that make it difficult for groups of residents to access housing and support

RESTRICTED USES

Proposals that include the following restricted uses will not be considered by the San Joaquin Community Foundation:

- Lobbying that seeks to influence legislation.
 - While organizations as a whole are not prohibited from engaging in lobbying activities to support their overall mission and goals, activities funded with SHIF proceeds cannot be tied to any direct lobbying activities around specific candidates or legislation at any level.
- Any activities that would violate the law and/or public policy.

TIMELINE

Below is the approximate timeline for application submissions. The Foundation will contact applicants by email. Organizations receiving awards will likely have contracts approved within 2-3 weeks after announcements. The full amount of funding will be sent to organizations approximately 2-3 weeks after contracts are signed.

SCORING

Proposals will be reviewed by the SHIF Community Oversight Board. Any organization applying for funding with staff or board members currently on the Community Oversight Board are eligible to apply. COB members who are staff or board members of an applying organization will not score applications from those organizations to avoid conflicts of interest. Award recommendations will be finalized by the San Joaquin Community Foundation Board of Directors. All proposals must meet the following Threshold Requirements:

Threshold Requirements:

- Meet eligible applicant criteria
- Proposed projects serve low to moderate-income residents in the City of Stockton
- Proposed activities fall within one of the three focus areas:
 - o Focus Area 1: Develop Local Capacity Around Affordable Housing
 - o Focus Area 2: Local Housing Impact
 - Focus Area 3: Addressing Racial Disparities

Proposals that do not meet the threshold requirements will not be scored.

Proposals will be scored on a 50-point scale with the opportunity for applicants to earn up to two (2) additional priority points based on BIPOC leadership and governance structure.

After submission, Grant Lifecycle Manager will provide Applicants with a confirmation message, a copy of the full application and a unique ID number will be sent to the email associated to the Grant Lifecycle account.
