# SUMMARY

The Community Grant Fund was established in partnership with the Children & Youth Task Force convened by the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors, the San Joaquin Children's Alliance, and the San Joaquin Community Foundation.

The San Joaquin Community Foundation is pleased to announce the successful disbursement of the Community Grant Fund. The grant recipients, through their dedicated efforts, have provided crucial 2-1-1 information and other vital resources, such as the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), employment, business support, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), education, rental/ mortgage assistance, mental health, and more. Their work has made a significant difference in our community.

With the aim of inclusivity, this funding was disbursed to a wide range of non-profits. Each organization, regardless of its size or focus, was given the opportunity to hold at least one event, resulting in over 150 community events in 2023-24. This inclusive approach has directly benefited over 88,000 residents throughout the county. Nonprofit organizations with 501(c)3 status located in San Joaquin County were eligible to apply for funding using San Joaquin Community Foundation's grants portal. Organizations were also allowed to apply with fiscal sponsorship from a 501(c)3 nonprofit, further expanding the reach of this initiative.

As a result, local nonprofits received 152 grants of up to \$3,000 each to host events to foster resilience within San Joaquin County. Funding was disbursed through two rounds, giving nonprofits another opportunity to submit their first or second applications for the grant.

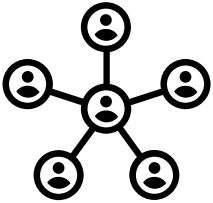
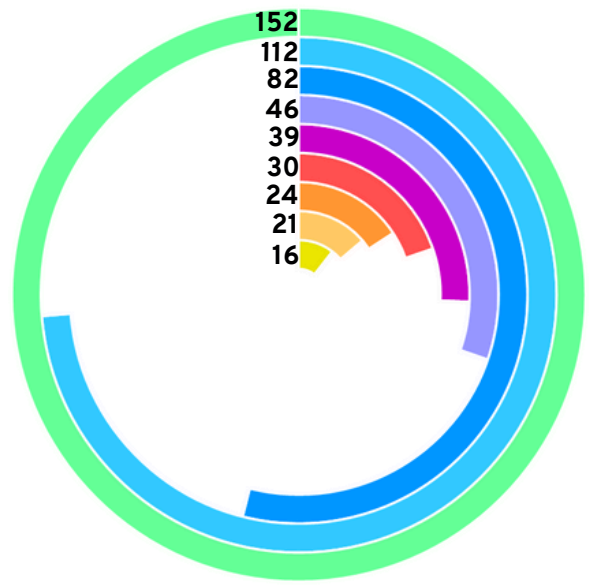

# COMMUNITY GRANT FUND: BY THE NUMBERS



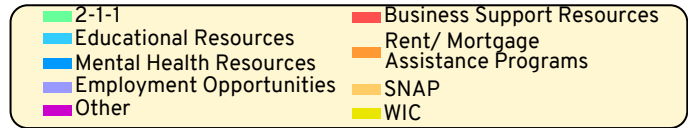

## NUMBER OF GRANTS USED TO PROMOTE RESOURCES

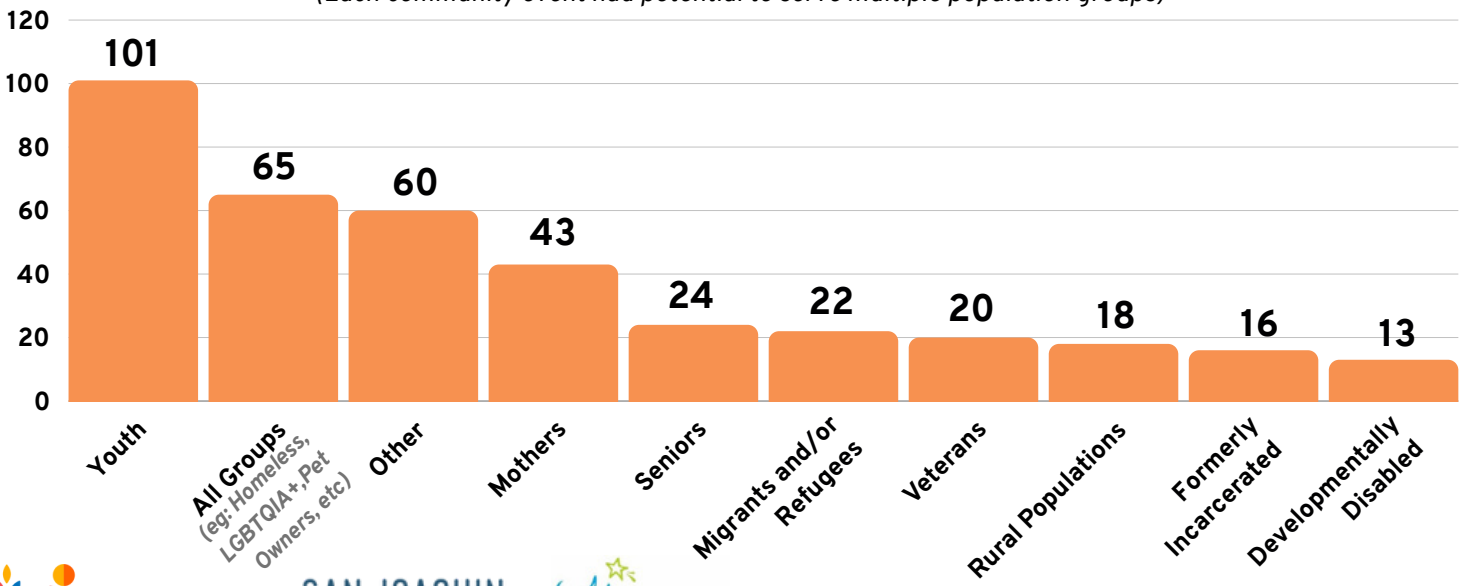

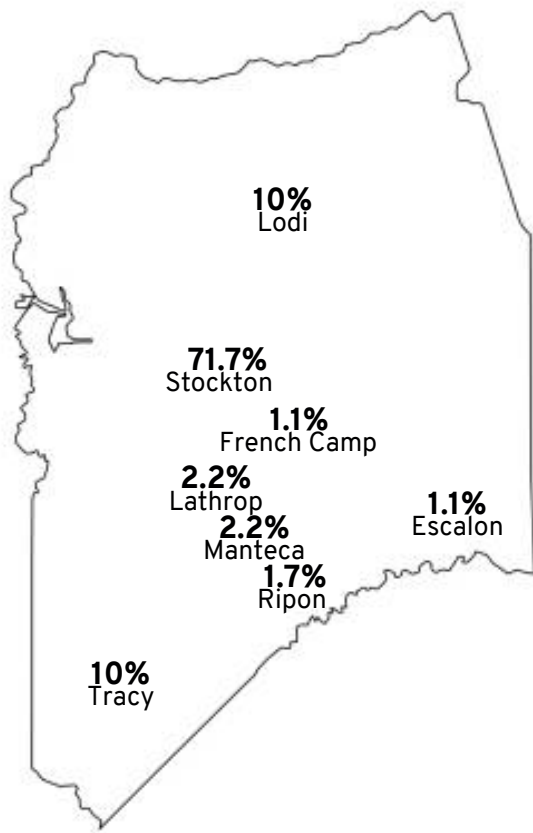

## NUMBER OF COMMUNITY EVENTS TARGETED TO POPULATION GROUPS

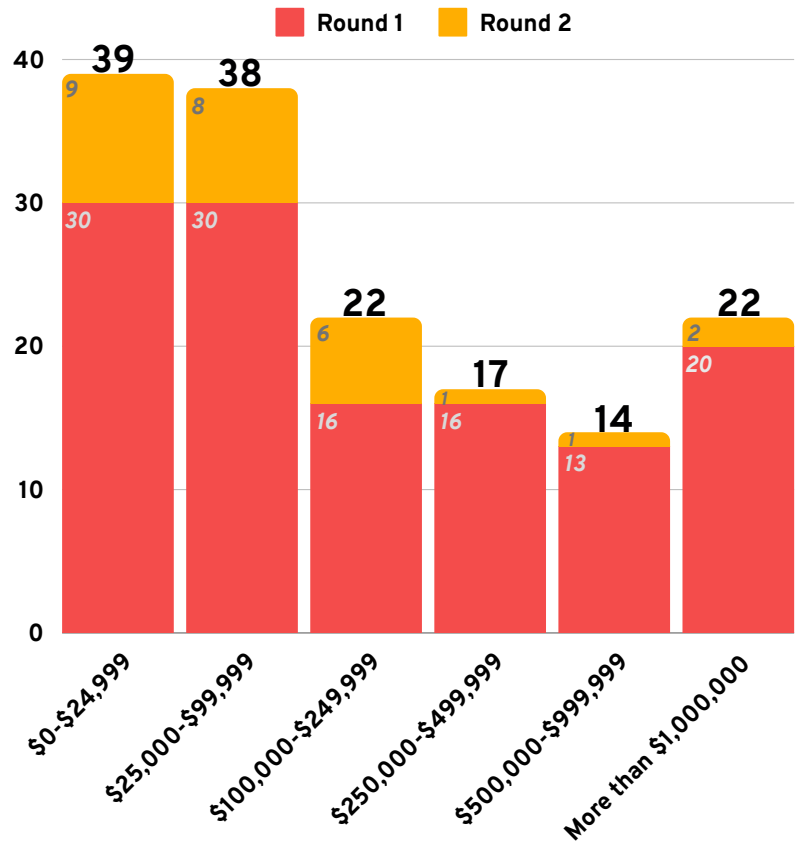

## OPERATING BUDGET OF NONPROFITS



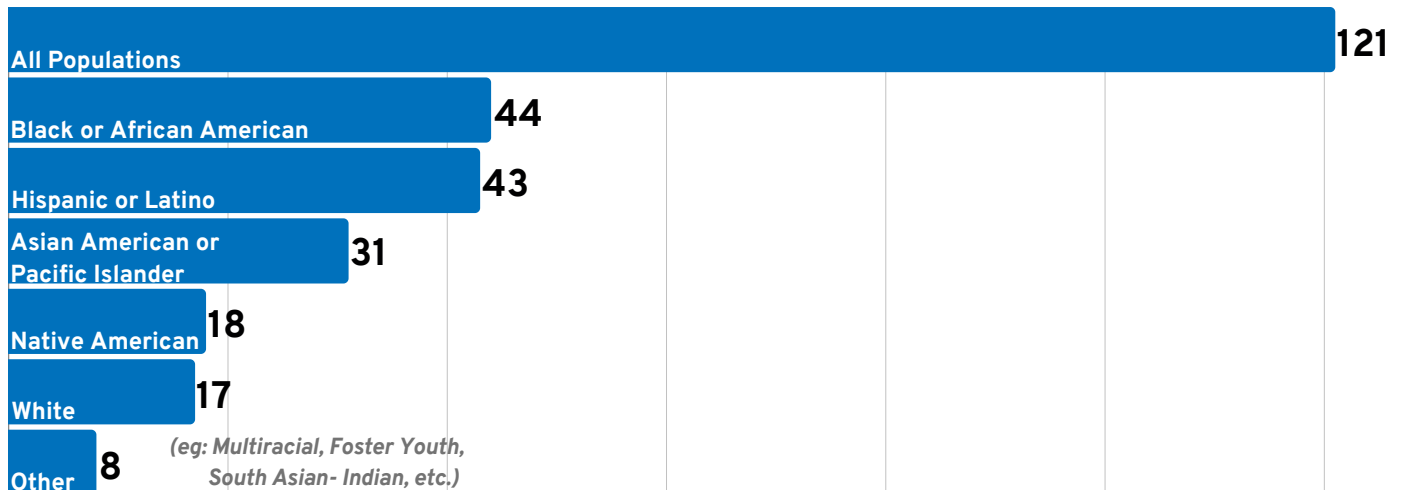
Over **28%** of community events were reported as held outside of Stockton.

# COMMUNITY EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

## SERVING THE YOUTH

### FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

Children & Youth Day at Pixie Woods Amusement Park in Stockton was held on June 3rd, 2023. 1,835 children and families were in attendance along with over 40 CBOs and businesses that provide services to children and youth. The event increased community awareness of services and opportunities available for children from infants to teens.



Attendees received info. about available health, literacy, education, transportation, nutrition, family strengthening programs, special needs care, childcare, child enrichment, and community services resources. Partners shared information about free COVID-19 tests and how to stay healthy. 211 flyers were made available at FRC agency tables, and 211 fun promotional items were given to attendees.

Children enjoyed facepainting, stepped onto the RTD electric bus and learned where it could take them, and enjoyed learning about the Hmong culture through a traditional dance group. Almost everyone who left had a smile on their face and thanked us as they were exiting the park for the opportunity to have family fun at no cost to them.

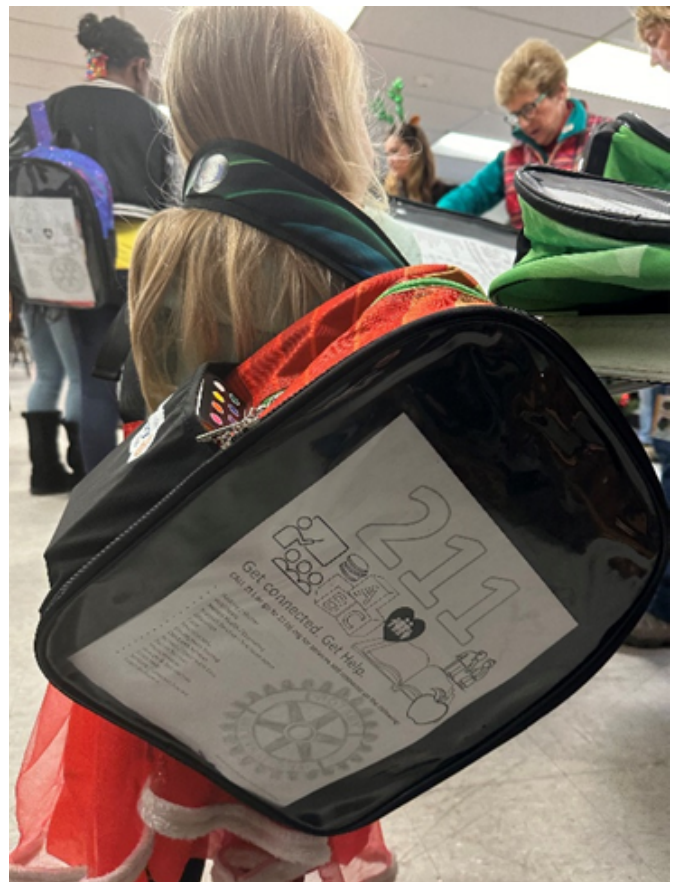


## **NORTH STOCKTON ROTARY ENDOWMENT**

On December 20, 2023, ten members of the North Stockton Rotary Club created a holiday themed party at the Shelter. Each child (seventy in total) was given a backpack purchased from ChalkWild. These backpacks come with nontoxic erasable coloring markers with which the children can individually decorate his/her backpack. Inside the backpack, the children were able to choose from books provided by the club, a new blanket, and a new stuffed animal.

Each child and his/her guardian entered a line where the backpacks were distributed by a Rotary member. Families were also provided information on 211. The Rotarian helped children select a book, a stuffed animal, and a cozy blanket.

The design and structure of the project met our goals, providing an enriching environment for 70 youths and their guardians while including educational material with books and 211 information. The North Stockton Rotary Club and its financial support structure, the NSR Endowment, feel that the success of the event warrants it to continue as an annual event.



## SOW A SEED FOUNDATION

The Boys to Men Conference is an uplifting and positive event using real-life approaches for realistic results. In this full day conference, youth explored essential topics such as career exploration, essential life skills, proper communication, conflict resolution, stress and anger management, problem solving and goal setting for young men. The objective of the program is for each participant to identify and internalize positive options to negative behaviors, identify available resources, and utilize effective communication skills.



Participants attended several professionally delivered workshops, a keynote address, panel discussion and enjoyed a nutritious catered lunch. The key focus areas included: healthy lifestyles, personal accountability, leadership development and alternatives to deviant behavior.

Funds were used to: purchase breakfast and lunch for participants, for media and marketing materials, youth event t-shirts, raffle items and giveaways for youth, printing, supplies, and equipment rentals.





## HOSPICE OF SAN JOAQUIN

Hospice of San Joaquin held a round-robin of 4 workshops for 4 different age levels of grieving children:

- 1) Arts & Crafts
- 2) Journaling
- 3) Media
- 4) Recreation (outdoor activity).

The purpose of Camp Caterpillar is to help children process their grief over the death of a loved one. Many of these children have had a parent die in the past 2 years.

We provided resources about low-cost or free counseling services; 211 provided pencils and information sheets for attendees.



## KELLY'S ANGELS FOUNDATION

Kelly's Angels Foundation, with the support of San Joaquin Community Foundation and The Table Community Foundation, handed out over 400 costumes to families in South Stockton. On October 14th every year, we provide food, games, face painting, community resources and costumes to families who sign up for this free event.

Child Abuse Prevention Council, Table Community Foundation, Prevail Women and Youth, Community Medical Centers, Sangre C.C, San Joaquin County Department of Child Support Services, 211, City of Stockton and San Joaquin County resources were all available at the event.



## **RAY OF HOPE CHILDREN'S CRISIS SERVICES**

Ray of Hope used the funding to hold an event for their Student Success Program, providing school essentials to over 700 children. Gifted items included: backpacks, clothes, books, school supplies, and hygiene essentials. The program successfully prepared youth for school, even those who were unhoused or not yet enrolled.

2-1-1 information was passed out to attendees.

## **FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH**

Our church held a 100th Anniversary event for our church building which featured food trucks, jumpers for kids, tours of the church, a yoga class, community and school music group performances, and booths from local community organizations who have partnered with the church. The public was invited to come and celebrate as well as learn about the church and the partner organizations who were there. Several local public officials attended, including the mayor.



The community organizations who were present with resources for the public were 211, Child Abuse Prevention Council, Family Promise, Little Manila Rising, The Well, Community Medical Centers, Grace and Mercy Charitable Foundation, and Amelia Ann Adams Whole Life Center.

# COMMUNITY EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

## SERVING MOTHERS

### MIMS CORNER

Mims Corner was able to hold its first community baby shower, and we were able to give single low-income mothers gifts and car seats, clothes, pampers and information on services given by 211 to help start their preparation for their new child's life. We collaborated with: Safe Kids, 211, First Five, San Joaquin Community Foundation and Amelia Ann Adams Whole Life Center. We held an amazing event, and we look forward to helping more single parents get prepared for their new bundle of joy.



Along with 2-1-1 information, parents were provided general information about resources available in the county. First Five gave out starter boxes to the parents of newborn babies. All parents were given a playpen, diaper bag, and an abundance of information for new parents on raising a newborn at home.





## THE LINKS INCORPORATED

We elected to use the funds to share gifts with new mothers and babies at the San Joaquin General Hospital. The Stockton CA Chapter of the Links Incorporated created 50 gift bags filled with items that will be beneficial to new mothers and babies which included: diapers, diaper wipes, nipple shields, onesies, bibs, and a baby healthcare and grooming kit. The bags also included 211 information in both English and Spanish to provide resources to families of San Joaquin County.

## DELTA RESEARCH AND EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

This parent workshop covered self-care, household communication, impact of the digital age, and substance use. The purpose of the event was to help identify red flags and provide tools to break the barriers in finding the appropriate emotional wellness services for youth and their families. Parents, guardians, and family of school-age children within San Joaquin County were invited to attend.

In addition to 2-1-1 information provided by the SJC Family Resource Center and the TAAC, the TAAC provided a CDC immunization schedule in each participant's grab bag. Additional information on COVID, flu, and other vaccinations was provided; specifically geared towards the Black and Brown communities.

## SERVING SENIORS



### **SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY JUNETEENTH FOUNDATION, INC**

San Joaquin Juneteenth Foundation, Inc. has hosted the Juneteenth celebration in Stockton for 47 years. This is a cultural event that focuses on underserved areas, promoting wellness and education. Throughout the day, we honored our elders in the community. One of the principal purposes of this foundation shall be to preserve, promote, and foster the awareness and development of the Juneteenth Celebration. Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the end of slavery in the United States. Future endeavors are to respect and for the appreciation of all, and to create new bonds of friendship and understanding among us. Continuous self-development and respect will be provided to all cultures.

### **SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY HISTORICAL MUSEUM**

Tractor Fest is an event that celebrates our county's legacy of innovations in agricultural engineering, which primarily targets families and older adults. The event included a tractor parade, exhibits on the history of mechanical engineering in San Joaquin County, educational stations for youth that focused on problem-solving and design skills in an agricultural context, and arts stations for plein air painting and drawing.

We maintained a table near the tractor parade that provided museum information and laptops set to 211sj.org. We had one designated laptop set to the Seniors/Older Adults section of the website. We also had CDC print flyers concerning hand washing and the urgency of testing for COVID-19.



# COMMUNITY EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

## SERVING VETERANS

### JOHN L EASTER'S HOMELESS VETERANS PROGRAM

We alerted the community about our new development project that is coming to their neighborhood. We informed them of how the project will help provide jobs, shelter, and mental health awareness. At our event, there was a multitude of people ranging from neighborhood families to Stockton public officials. We provided our guests with plenty of food, drinks, singing and laughter. We had Rashel Wulff from CBS news and special speakers such as our public officials. We provided flyers that were circulated throughout the community and safety sanitary supplies for attendees.



### WOODEN BOATS FOR VETERANS FOUNDATION

We provided a sailing outing on October 7th, 2023 for veterans from San Joaquin County aboard a partner vessel operated by the Call of the Sea Foundation. The veterans experienced the camaraderie and the calming beauty only found aboard beautiful boats on the San Francisco Bay. VA benefits guidebooks were handed out to veterans who do not yet have access to their benefits, and were given the point of contact at the veteran services office.

## SERVING THE DEVELOPMENTALLY DISABLED



### HEALINGS IN MOTION

Healings in Motion is very appreciative to be a recipient of the Community Grant Fund. Healings in Motion's funds supported the 10th Annual Brain Health to Beat Stroke, which was held August 10, 2023, at the University of the Pacific. There were many other resources at the event. The California State Council on Developmental Disabilities and The Red Cross provided Emergency Bags to many participants. Valley Air shared information on Air Quality. Information on Stroke Symptoms, Blood Pressure, Diabetes, Cholesterol was distributed. Organ Donors and Public Health had educational flyers and updated COVID-19 information.

### THE VILLAGE

Kaleidoscope, a community integration and fundraising event, was held at Five Window Beer Company on Friday, May 12, 2023. Attendees included participants in The Village adult day program, their families, and the greater community. Guests enjoyed dinner, live music, a silent auction, and the opportunity to pursue pamphlets about the program, 2-1-1 services, mental health services, and other community resources.

Pamphlets about The Village adult day program and community center for people with special needs, 2-1-1 services, mental health services and other community resources were available to guests.



# COMMUNITY EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

## SERVING MIGRANTS/ REFUGEES

### HEALTHFORCE PARTNERS OF NORTHERN SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY

On March 24, 2023, HealthForce Partners, in partnership with over 20 community-based organizations, hosted a Community Health Fair and Vaccination Clinic in South Stockton. The event served a neighborhood with a high concentration of immigrants who don't speak English or have access to quality health care.



In our Resource Fair, Community Organizations handed out information and giveaways such as: COVID tests, employment applications, fruits and vegetables, 211 resources, and housing information. Our COVID clinic vaccinated over 30 individuals, including a few first doses. Lastly, community members also enjoyed free food in our food truck alley, refreshments, and live music from the DJ who kept the energy high.



### CHALKWILD

ChalkWild benefitted the community by distributing free backpacks with 2-1-1 information provided inside. ChalkWild is dedicated to improving the mental health and creativity of children through art. Children, including those of migrant farm workers, have enhanced their social emotional skills through artistic expression.



# COMMUNITY EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

## SERVING RURAL POPULATIONS

### A TO Z PSYCHOTHERAPY

At-risk youth & youth in rural areas are at a higher risk of being a victim of Human Trafficking. Often, youth, parents & the community at large lack key knowledge related to risk & protective factors regarding human trafficking. Following the COVID-19 pandemic, we saw an increase in the adaptability of traffickers, thus increasing the risk to youth in our local communities.



A to Z Psychotherapy hosted two Mental Health Workshops focused on educating our community about human trafficking. Our workshops taught youth and their parents to recognize the signs that human trafficking may be occurring in one's community. In addition, resources were provided for victims/survivors of human trafficking. Finally, we provided follow up resources related to ongoing mental health needs. Our workshops brought awareness and provided resources to help decrease the risk to youth in our community.

# COMMUNITY EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

## SERVING THE FORMERLY INCARCERATED

### COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP FOR FAMILIES OF SAN JOAQUIN

The tattoo removal event is an opportunity to improve the employability of those who have visible tattoos, especially those on the face and neck. It is offered through re-entry services, but is open to the community. We broadened the scope of this event to add more of a resource fair aspect. The event focused on removing visible tattoos that impede community reintegration and job attainment of the formerly incarcerated. We currently focus solely on those needing tattoos removed.

## SERVING ALL GROUPS



### SHAW 4 COMMUNITY

Shaw 4 Community Hosted a mini-Health and Wellness Fair in conjunction with a Health and Wellness Hike. In the morning, individuals from the community gathered at The SHAW Bar, where guest speakers (nutritionist, mental health clinician, family support service worker) spoke to the individuals in attendance. We provided educational discussions, 211 cards/pamphlets, educational pamphlets with regard to Stockton resources, nutritional guidance, suicide support, and mental health

services. We then got on charter buses and proceeded to have a 2-mile Health and Wellness hike. We began with a meditation session. As well as a stretch/workout session. Followed by a 5-minute Mental Health Awareness talk led by a licensed Mental Health Clinician. Lunch, music, support, swag and hydration were provided.

### FAMILY DAY AT THE PARK

Family Day at the Park was a huge success in 2023! We had over 20,000 guests in attendance for this FREE event. Attendees were able to speak with over 80 different organizations about the resources available to them, all while kids were able to participate in some kind of interactive project. These projects ranged from creating their own bookmark, working with clay to create a sculpture, or learning where water goes after it goes through a drain. 211 was available at the Family Resource Center booth located in Alphabet Alley. Hand sanitizer and masks were also made available throughout the event. Healthy Highway education about the COVID-19 vaccination was available for attendees.





## **MEXICAN HERITAGE CENTER & GALLERY, INC.**

Our Dia de los Muertos Community Street Fiesta took place on Saturday, October 28, 2023. We had more than a thousand people attending the fiesta this year. There was a total of 72 vendors selling different items. There were 6 delicious food vendors selling the people's favorite foods. Entertainment included the Cesar Chavez Mariachi group and the Raices folkloric student dance group.

COVID testing, flu shots, and charter school registration were offered at the event through partnerships created.

Fifteen organizations created altars for their loved ones. Overall, this year, the Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) event was very successful.



## **ENCOUNTER GLOBAL INC**

Encounter Global held an annual event to foster unity, understanding, and collaboration among diverse communities. This event achieved its goals of meeting the physical needs of our community through various free resources including food, groceries, clothing, hygiene products, haircuts, housing assistance, medical assistance, medical supplies, health awareness, and counseling.



# COMMUNITY EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

## SERVING OTHER GROUPS



### COMPASSION WITH PURPOSE

We offered free microchipping clinics for dogs and cats in Stockton and Manteca. We collaborated with a local business (Cerri Feed) and animal shelters in Stockton and Manteca to expand our reach to pets needing microchips. In total, we microchipped 374 dogs and cats. We distributed handouts on low-cost vet care services in San Joaquin County. The flyers featured the 211 information on the printed materials.

### TRACY PRIDE

Saturday, October 7th, 2023, started with music from our DJ, and the basic introduction sessions. Giving tribute to our country, we had a local singer sing the national anthem. Entertainment included performances from local musicians and skaters while vendors kept attendees occupied. There were areas for attendees to play video games and group games. A professional photographer took pictures of the event. 2-1-1 information in Spanish and English was provided at the event along with MPOX vaccination, voting information, community opportunities, info on a health clinic serving LGBTQ individuals, and other non-profit informational booths.





## **IHUB SAN JOAQUIN**

iHub San Joaquin was pleased to host the Innovation Summit & Annual Meeting at the Great Wolf Lodge Indoor Water Park Resort in Manteca. The summit was held as a breakfast, and the half-day event featured a Business Expo with a dozen participants who shared their companies, products, and small business development services. Topics and speakers at the summit included small business resources, innovative technologies in California that are transcending regional economies, and diverse startup founders who have found success in scaling their companies.

This grant assisted in the development and implementation of a stellar event that helped elevate the need to foster an ecosystem of new technologies and innovation in the region.



## **HATCH WORKSHOP**

With these funds, we were able to fund our second annual music festival, "Fall of Summer Festival". Community partners Vegan Soulstice and DryCleaners helped bring vendors to serve food and to sell goods at the festival. The Unknown Space Arts Ensemble and Inner G also supported it. The festival was designed and built around supporting young local musicians and developing the culture of creative production and DIY organization. We are particularly proud of our commitment to the local economy, and seeing the dollars reach so many of the driven local creatives was itself a tremendous success.

2-1-1 information, PPE, hand sanitizer, water, and local artists' business cards were passed out.
